Staying up late on weekends may drive excess weight gain in school-aged children, possibly due to "social jet lag" disrupting their ability to process food efficiently. Previous research suggests that children who get less than the recommended amount of sleep per night are more likely to become overweight, but less is known about the effect of inconsistent bedtimes. To learn more, Heli Viljakainen at the University of Helsinki, Finland, and her colleagues took body measurements from more than 10,000 children aged 9 to 11, who were asked about their sleep routines. Half of the children were measured again 2.5 years later. The initial measurements showed that the children who reported going to bed later on weekends compared with school nights had a higher waist-to-height ratio than those with consistent bedtimes throughout the week. They also had a higher body mass index (BMI), which is calculated from height and weight, and was adjusted for the children's age and sex. Going to bed two hours later on weekends, for example, was associated with a 2.4-centimetre larger waist circumference and a 0.32 higher BMI in children measuring 148 centimetres tall, after adjusting the results to account for sleep duration and certain lifestyle factors, such as screen time.
